



Wolfson Harrison Physics Scholarship 2024-25

Further Particulars

The Wolfson Harrison Physics Scholarships are generously funded by Dr Simon Harrison. Dr Harrison is an alumnus of the Wolfson College and the Department of Physics, having completed a DPhil in Applied Physics at Oxford. He retains a strong connection with Wolfson College and takes a keen interest in the work and progress of the students supported by his Scholarship.

Degree type and subject

The Wolfson Harrison Physics Scholarships, offered in partnership with the Clarendon Fund for 2024-2025, are open to any applicants who are applying for a DPhil based in the Department of Physics in any branch of Physics. Up to two scholarships are available for 2024 entry.

Value of awards

Course Fees and a grant for living costs for full-time students up to the UKRI Minimum Doctoral Stipend (£18,622 in 2023-24) for the duration of fee liability; part time students will receive a proportional study support grant. Previous Oxford students are advised to check their fee liability on the [University's Fees and Funding](#) pages for any applicable adjustments to fee liability resulting from prior study.

Partnership

The scholarships are offered in partnership with the Clarendon Fund for 2024-25 entry.

How to apply

There is no separate application process. All applicants should apply to the University of Oxford under the [standard procedures](#) for graduate degrees for 2024-25. Applications should be made by the January deadline for your eligible course. If there are two or more candidates of equal academic merit, priority will be given to the candidate who has listed Wolfson as their first-choice college on their University application form. The Scholar will become a member of Wolfson College for the duration of their studies.
