



Annual award of a DPhil scholarship of £5,500 in Tibetan and Himalayan Studies

Wolfson College

Wolfson College is pleased to offer one DPhil scholarship of £5,500 for a student working on any aspect of Tibetan and Himalayan Studies. The scholarship has been established thanks to the generosity of the Dalai Lama Trust and the Tise Foundation. It is awarded for the duration of one academic year and is renewable, subject to satisfactory progress. The successful candidate will be associated with Wolfson College.

Eligibility

The scholarship is available to suitably qualified individuals who are applying for a DPhil in the Faculty of Oriental Studies for entry in October 2021, or current students on a DPhil course in the Faculty of Oriental Studies, with a research topic in Tibetan and Himalayan Studies. The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other partial awards, but the total value of your scholarships should not exceed the cost of course fees in full and a grant for living costs at a rate agreed with Graduate Admissions and Recruitment.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic merit and potential. The scholarship is open to UK, EU, or Overseas students and will be tenable only for one year at a time. Students holding the scholarship who would wish to reapply for it for the following year would be required to submit a new application for that year. Renewal is contingent on satisfactory progress, and evidence of satisfactory progress will be sought from the DPhil supervisor.

- **Prospective applicants for graduate study**

Applicants applying for a DPhil for entry in October 2021, and who submit their application to the University by the January 2021 deadline at the latest, will be automatically considered.

- **Current students**

On-course students should **submit the application form by Monday 5 April 2021** to academic.office@wolfson.ox.ac.uk and **ask their supervisor to submit a supporting statement to the same email address by the same deadline.**
