Rachael is an equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI) expert with several years of experience running inclusion programmes and advising businesses on how to create equity in the workplace. She directs the Mayor of London's Workforce Integration programme to increase the representation of young Black men in tech. Rachael is a seasoned trainer and facilitator having designed and delivered scores of highly acclaimed EDI workshops and training to companies in the UK and internationally, using her research skills to create effective and engaging sessions. She has led extensive EDI audits across companies in various sectors, identifying areas of inequality and supporting businesses to implement change. Rachael has worked with FTSE100 companies, government departments, NGOs and creative agencies, and has pioneered inclusion programmes and recruitment drives for underrepresented groups. She works closely with senior leaders, HR professionals, and employee network groups to advance the cause of EDI in several organisations.

Rachael holds a law degree and spent an enriching year studying at the historically Black women's college, Spelman College. She graduated from the University of Oxford, Wolfson College, in 2015 with an MSc in Migration Studies, for which she crowdfunded over £10,000 in 10 days for her tuition fees. This led to her becoming a Churchill Fellow, where she travelled across the USA, South Africa, and Kenya to learn about access to quality education for those from disadvantaged backgrounds.
