

Rachel Conrad Scholarship (for the study of Clinical Depression)

Further Particulars

This endowed scholarship has been made possible thanks to a generous legacy from Reuben Conrad CBE in memory of his late wife, Rachel.

Degree type and subject

The Rachel Conrad Scholarship is available for applicants who are applying to undertake a DPhil specialising in the study of clinical depression.

Value of award

Course Fees and a grant for living costs for full-time students up to the UKRI Minimum Doctoral Stipend (£18,622 in 2023-24) for the duration of fee liability; part time students will receive a proportional study support grant. Previous Oxford students are advised to check their fee liability on the <u>University's Fees</u> and <u>Funding</u> pages for any applicable adjustments to fee liability resulting from prior study.

Partnership

The scholarship is offered in partnership with the Clarendon Fund.

How to apply

There is no separate application process. All applicants should apply to the University of Oxford under the <u>standard procedures</u> for graduate degrees for 2024-25. Applications should be made by the January deadline for your eligible course. If there are two or more candidates of equal academic merit, priority will be given to the candidate who has listed Wolfson as their first choice college on their University application form. The Scholar will become a member of Wolfson College for the duration of their studies.
