

Oxford-Wolfson-Marriott-Graduate Scholarships 2026-27 Further Particulars

The Oxford Wolfson Marriott Scholarships have been made possible thanks to a generous donation to Wolfson College from the late Dr Francis Marriott, who was a University Lecturer and Fellow of Wolfson from 1970 until his death in 2012. Dr Marriott conducted research in the field of biomathematics and taught statistics. The scholarships are jointly-funded by the Oxford Graduate Scholarship Matched Fund.

Eligible degree subjects

Wolfson College will be offering Oxford Wolfson Marriott Scholarships in the following subjects for 2026-27 entry:

Interdisciplinary Life and Environmental Science

A scholarship for a DPhil in Interdisciplinary Life and Environmental Science, offered in partnership with the MPLS Doctoral Training Centre.

Oncology

A scholarship for a DPhil in Oncology, offered in partnership with the Department of Oncology.

Condensed Matter Physics [Pending confirmation]

A scholarship for a DPhil in Condensed Matter Physics, offered in partnership with the Sub-Department of Condensed Matter Physics.

Mathematics

A scholarship for a DPhil in Mathematics, offered in partnership with the Mathematical Institute.

The scholarships cover Course Fees (at the Home/ROI fee rate) and a grant for living costs (up to the UKRI Minimum Doctoral Stipend, which was £20,780 in 2025-2026). A student on a part-time course will receive a study support grant instead. Awards are made for the full duration of fee liability for the agreed course. The awards will be made in partnership with a number of departments, faculties and centres for doctoral training that may, exceptionally, enhance an award to bring it up to the Overseas Course Fee rate.

How to apply

There is no separate application process. Applicants, whether internal or external, should apply to the University of Oxford under the <u>standard procedures</u> for graduate degrees for 2026-27. Applications must be made by the relevant deadline for your chosen course and all eligible applications will be considered. If there are two or more candidates of equal academic merit, priority will be given to the candidate who has listed Wolfson as their first-choice college on the University application form. The successful scholar will become a member of Wolfson College for the duration of their studies.
